

# THE MISSOURI SYMPHONY

Here at the Missouri Symphony we value the health and safety of all our patrons and the public who enjoy our performances. While we are incredibly grateful to be able to continue to provide quality symphonic entertainment and education to the mid-Missouri community, in an effort to reduce the risk to our community and adhere to the rules and guidelines set forth by the CDC, the City of Columbia, and the University of Missouri we ask that our guests and patrons follow these rules while attending Missouri Symphony events:

- Maintain a minimum physical distance of 6 ft from those outside of your own household
- Wear a face covering at all times (coverings will not be provided at the venue)
- Practice good hygiene (wash hands, cough/sneeze into elbow, etc.)

In addition to following the above rules, the Missouri Symphony and Missouri Theatre staff and crew will provide our patrons with the following in return:

- Readily available hand sanitizer in theatre lobbies and soap in restrooms
- Increased venue cleaning
- Staff members available on hand to aid when and where needed

If you are experiencing any of these symptoms, we ask that you please STAY HOME:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

## **How does MOSY plan to protect its musicians?**

Our musicians are the center of our organization and mission; without them, there is no MOSY! Therefore, we are dedicated to providing a safe place for our musicians to work and perform. To achieve this, we plan to adhere to the following rules:

- To have all musicians seated at a physical distance of at least 6 ft
- To require all musicians to wear face coverings when able
- To require any musician experiencing the above-listed symptoms to stay home
